
How to find us:

Speakers:

Philip Bell: (BSc, CBiol, MIBiol, PGCE)

Philip studied biology and geology at the University of Wales (Swansea), graduating in zoology in 1989. For nine years he worked at a cancer research unit in chemosensitivity testing. During the 1990s, he was a member of the Postgraduate School of Medicine, Bath University.

While he was there, he (co-)authored a number of papers on anticancer drug stability, new drug screening, drug resistance and programmed cell death (apoptosis). Philip became a secondary school science teacher in the late 1990s, but has worked full time in creation ministry since 2001.

Paul Garner: (BSc, FGS)

Paul has a degree in Environmental
Sciences - Geology/Biology and is a
Fellow of the Geological Society. Until
October 2002, he was employed as a Senior Information
Scientist for a pharmaceutical company in Cambridge.

Since then he has been involved full time in creation ministry, travelling all over the UK and overseas - speaking in churches, public meetings, schools and universities.

He is currently part of a team engaged in a major fiveyear study of an extensive sandstone formation that occurs in Grand Canyon and throughout the Colorado Plateau of the western USA.

Steve Lloyd: (MA, PhD)

Steve studied Natural Science at the University of Cambridge and continued there obtaining his PhD for research in

Materials Science. He spent a further eight years in post-doctoral research in Cambridge as a Junior Research Fellow and then a Royal Society University Research Fellow. His research used electron microscopy to study the structure of magnetic thin films and the localised deformation behaviour of ultra-hard coatings. He has published over 50 research papers. After leaving scientific research Steve obtained a Diploma in Theology and Religious Studies from the University of Cambridge.

Andy McIntosh: (DSc, FIMA, CMath, FInstE, CEng, FInstP, MGEM, FRAeS)

Andy holds a chair in Thermodynamics and Combustion Theory in the Faculty of Engineering at the University of Leeds. As a mathematician, he worked for four years on aerodynamic design in a Government Research Establishment, before entering academia to follow a career in lecturing and research. He is the author of the book *Genesis for Today* (published by Day

One). * Professor McIntosh is not speaking on behalf of Leeds University and the views expressed by Professor McIntosh are not those of Leeds University.

Paul Taylor: (BSc, MSc, PGCE)

Paul studied Chemistry at Nottingham
University where he obtained a BSc
and a PGCE. He later obtained an MSc
in Science Education from Cardiff University.
Before becoming involved in full time creation ministry in
2005, Paul had spent several years working in IT. Previously,
he had been a school science teacher for 17 years, eventually
becoming Head of Department. He was also involved in
developing school curricula, particularly at the inception of
the National Curriculum. He is the author of the books The
Six Days of Genesis, and Truth, Lies and Science Education.
